Information on Technical Intern Training

Preventing Disappearances(Abscondence) —

The technical intern training program is operated with the objective of transferring Japan's technologies, skills, and knowledge to adult workers from developing countries and thereby contribute to human resource development and social and economic growth in those countries. When considering this objective, it is highly regrettable that there have been occasional cases of technical intern trainees disappearing during training.

Such disappearances generally lead to offenses that violate the Immigration Control Act, such as illegal employment and illegal overstay. There have also been some rare cases where absconders have become involved in serious criminal offenses such as theft, burglary and drug trafficking. The act of disappearing disrupts the very foundation of Japan's immigration control, harms social and economic order, and increases the occurrence of an array of issues, including human rights issues stemming from discriminatory treatment of foreign nationals.

Keep in mind that disappearing for selfish reasons would not only hurt your career, but would also cause undue worry and problems for many people around you, including your family, friends, colleagues, and your sending, supervising and implementing organizations. Also be aware that if the number of absconders increases substantially, the responsibility of implementing and supervising organizations would be questioned, and they may be barred from receiving any more technical intern trainees. This policy is clearly stipulated in the revised Immigration Control Act of December 2009, as well as in a ministerial ordinance of the Ministry of Justice and the "Guidelines Concerning the Entry and Residence Management of Technical Intern Trainees," which was announced by the Ministry of Justice Immigration Bureau pursuant to the above law and ordinance.

For your part as technical intern trainees, you are asked to renew your awareness that your primary purpose of coming to Japan is to acquire technologies, skills and knowledge so that you may contribute to social and economic development in your country after you return, and to develop a spirit of observing all rules toward this end.

At the same time, never be enticed into disappearing by persuasive talk about being able to earn much more money elsewhere, avoid consorting with illegal workers and illegal overstayers, and regularly converse with your colleagues based on a relationship of trust to discourage any one of you from absconding.

Should you have a concern or a problem, consult with a technical intern training coordinator or lifestyle advisor in your implementing organization, a consultant in your supervising organization, or a member of your sending organization. Also at JITCO, Chinese, Indonesian and Vietnamese staff members who are fully familiar with the technical intern training system are on call to provide native language consultation over the phone or by mail.

個人の利己的な失踪は、自分自身の経歴に傷がつくだけでなく、家族・友人・同僚・送出し機関・監理団体・実習実施機関など多くの関係者に心配や迷惑をかけることを肝に銘じてください。さらに、2009年12月に改正された入管法、法務省令やそれを受けて法務省入国管理局が公表した「技能実習生の入国・まり申うかんり かん たいますので、そのことをよく認識してください。

そして、「もっと稼げるところがある」などの甘い言葉で、安易にます。 かんゆう に失踪の勧誘にのらないことはもちろん、不法就労者、不法 を発留者とは付き合わないようにし、仲間内からといこと とないよう、普段から何でも語り合える信頼関係を築いておくことが大切です。
