Schools hold *nyugakushiki* (school entrance ceremonies) for their new first-year students. Most elementary schools will hold their *nyugakushiki* on April 6 this year. This will be a perfect time, because the cherry blossoms will be in full bloom, cheering on the students as they enter new schools.

Companies also hold *nyushashiki* (company initiation ceremonies) for their *shinnyu shain* (new recruits). At these ceremonies the new recruits are officially recognized as employees, and from the president and others, they receive words of encouragement that are meant to instill in them a sense of belonging. This custom, based
