Prepare for the Unexpected

Winter in Japan is characterized by dry air, making it a season prone to fires. Check the "Home Fire Prevention -10 Tips for Protecting Your Life" (4 habits + 6 measures) available on the Public Relations Office website and take precautions to prevent a fire in your home.

In the event of a large earthquake

Japan is prone to earthquakes. In the event of a large earthquake, there is a risk of houses and furniture collapsing. Fires, tsunami, and landslides might also occur. Should a large earthquake occur, heed the following points and act calmly.

- ✓ First, ensure your physical safety by taking cover under a table or similar shelter.
- Quickly turn off the stove and close the main gas valve to prevent a fire.
- ✓ In coastal areas along the sea or rivers, tsunami damage is a concern. Evacuate to a higher place, such as a hill or tsunami evacuation tower.
- ✓ Be cautious of glass shards, falling objects, collapsing block walls, and severed power lines when evacuating.
- Be wary of malicious rumors and false information. Gather accurate information from sources such as the TV, radio, and mobile phones.
- Aftershocks will likely occur, so be well prepared and mentally ready.
- ✓ Go to an evacuation center if your house is damaged and you cannot live there. School gymnasiums and community centers often serve as evacuation centers. You will be given food, water, and blankets, and can stay there overnight. As you will be living with many people, be sure to follow the rules.

What is the 育成就労 (Employment for Skill Development) Program?

Topic of

Interest

The Technical Intern Training Program allows foreign nationals to acquire skills in Japan and apply them to the development of their home countries after they return. This June, Japan decided to replace this with a new program called 育成就労 (Employment for Skill Development). Under the new program, foreign workers will learn skills in Japan that will enable them to qualify for the Specified Skilled Worker status in three years, allowing them to work in the same field as Specified Skilled Workers. Additionally, the new system will allow foreign workers to transfer to a different company in the same field if certain conditions are met.

When will the new program begin?

It will begin by June 2027 at the latest.

Can I continue my technical intern training after the new program begins?

You can continue your training in Japan until your technical intern training period ends.

Who can I ask about details of the new program?

Consult people in your supervising organization, your accepting company, or a registered support organization. The JITCO website and the website of the Immigration Services Agency will also provide detailed updates as necessary.

Above is a summary of the information available at this stage. The new system has not yet begun, and your residence status will not suddenly change. Your situation remains unchanged. You can rest

assured that you can continue your training under your existing status until your training period ends.

There may be individuals who spread false information, saying that the system has changed or that you can now easily transfer jobs, and encourage you to take actions that may violate the law. Please be cautious not to be deceived.



Were you able to write the characters accurately, distinguishing the positions of the dashes (,), the number of strokes and how they are arranged, and inward and outward curves? The character \mathbb{R} is a combination of \mathbb{H} (eye) and \mathcal{L} (person), but the similar-looking character \mathbb{R} represents the shape of a cowry shell and differs in origin from \mathbb{R} . The other groups of kanji are also both similar to and different from each other. \bigstar symbolizes a person standing with arms and legs spread open. \bigstar represents the shape of a dog running, drawn vertically. \bigstar originally comes from \Re , which expresses plenty of water flowing through one's hands.
